


# Ellerton Church Preservation Trust

Dear friends, welcome to the first newsletter of the Ellerton Church Preservation Trust which must begin, alas, with some very sad news.

## **Stephen Warburton (1950-2004)**

Some of you will already be aware that Stephen Warburton - Secretary to the Trust since its foundation in 1995 - died suddenly on 19<sup>th</sup> January this year, at the age of fifty-three. He was a genuinely modest and unassuming man, and many who read the moving obituaries published in *The Independent*, the *Guardian* and the *Yorkshire Post*, realised with surprise the extraordinary range of his interests and the tremendous influence he had on the conservation of wildlife and landscape in Britain. More of you probably knew him as the polite bearded man who greeted you in the church porch on open days, answered your questions and charmed you into signing the visitors' book.

Stephen was central to the long, hard and ultimately successful campaign to protect the River Derwent and the magical landscape of the Derwent ings. From the early 1990s he was also tireless in his efforts to rescue and repair the abandoned Ellerton Priory church, realising that this ancient place of the spirit was essential to the cultural landscape of the Lower Derwent Valley. The glorious new east window, installed only four months before his death, was inspired by him and is his triumph. He last visited the church in November 2003 to see the wonderful nave pews, which were his gift to the Trust and the village.

On Sunday, 13<sup>th</sup> June, the church will open as part of a **Special Village Open Day** organised by the *Yorkshire Wildlife Trust* in memory of Stephen. Simple refreshments will be available, and guided tours will take place at 11.30 am, 1.30 pm and 3.30 pm. The lovely organic garden at *Tregonning*, beside the village pond, will also be open and clotted cream teas will be served from 2.30 pm. During the afternoon there will be a walk through the precious ings meadows led by Len Charlesworth - an ECPT trustee, local farmer and great friend of Stephen. We hope you might bring pic-nic to share in the churchyard or have a drink in the good, old-fashioned village pub, *The Boot and Shoe*.

Before his death, Stephen asked if he might have a memorial at Ellerton. The trustees are proud to be able to offer him this tribute, and a fine wall monument is to be commissioned by his friends and placed inside the church beside his favourite window.

## **A 'royal' window on history**

Speaking of windows, a tiny tribute to Stephen has also been included in our newest piece of stained glass. This Summer a splendid heraldic panel will be installed in the nave to complete our series of three representing the building history of Ellerton Priory. Made by Alfred Fisher, celebrated stained glass artist and Past Master of the Glaziers Company, the new window includes the arms of the mediaeval Gilbertine canons surrounded by the beautifully-lettered names of their Yorkshire houses, and is made of sumptuous 'streaky' glasses left over from a window Alfred made for HM the Queen's private chapel in Buckingham Palace in 2003.


